10:30- 11:10	Breakout Session I “Lesson Sketch” Grounded in an aesthetic framework, this presentation explores a perceptual approach to lesson planning, known as a lesson sketch, and its implications with regard to literacy instruction. Lesson sketches involve six learning dimensions: connections, risk-taking, imagination, sensory experience, perceptivity, and active engagement (Uhrmacher, Conrad, & Moroye, 2013). In considering the implications of employing lesson sketches in the classroom, particular attention will be paid to their impact on recalling prior knowledge as well as how this curricular practice might change the nature in which students are labeled. Additional resources for lesson sketches will be made available through the presentation.
